



A simple orange shirt has become a conversation starter for all aspects of residential school across Canada and beyond. Phyllis has inspired thousands and thousands of people to honour residential school survivors and their families and share the call on September 30th of each year that "EVERY CHILD MATTERS." Phyllis is well respected for her work, her courage and for striving to heal our communities and Nation through speaking her truth.


TRUDY'S HEALING STONE




PHYLLIS'S ORANGE SHIRT






THE EAGLE FEATHER





This engaging First Nation's story teaches children that it is okay to have feelings and shows them how to process and release negative thoughts.

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


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


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LE CAILLOU DE TRUDY



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
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
