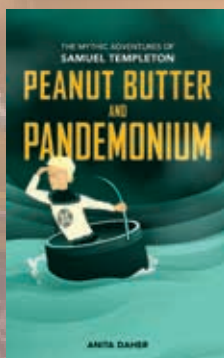

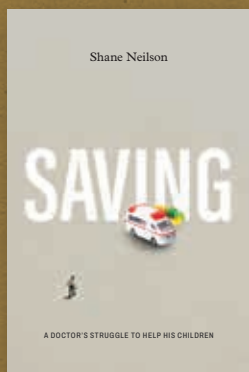

When his two-year old son develops epilepsy, Shane Neilson, a doctor, struggles to obtain timely medical care for him. *Saving* shares his family's journey through the medical system, and also Shane's own personal journey as a father who feels powerless when faced with his child's illness.
